Stay well and active this term, please ensure that kids are having their breakfast every day. It's an essential fuel for the body to start the day



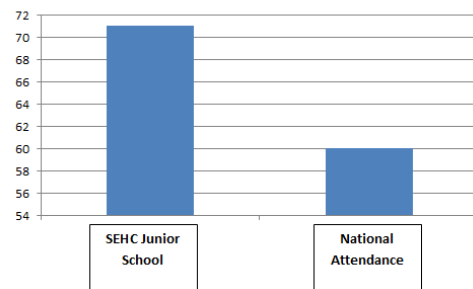

Collegiate Attendance: Every day counts Junior School vs National Attendance



There is an expression that goes 'Being There Counts' Research states that if you aren't at school, its likely you are not going to have a successful life. Your job

opportunities shrink if you have not got NCEA Level 2. Again the research says you get these qualifications by being at school at least 95% of the time or nearly every day. So for that reason we have attendance as a major Collegiate target. Recently the Ministry of Education gave us some statistics which show we are doing very well with attendance and we have significantly higher attendance than other similar schools. (Over 10% better) This is very good news but remember we need your tamariki/child at school every day. It counts and the habits your child learns today will be the pattern of their future attendance in Middle and Senior School.

Health & Safety: Guy Fawkes 5th November

I enjoy fireworks but they do require adult supervision and a great deal of care. Every year children suffer needless burns and there is always property damage. You must be 18 years and over to buy fireworks. Fireworks are totally banned from school. For every one of our juniors it is illegal for them to buy fireworks. Children are not allowed to buy fireworks and shops selling them to under age children are committing an offence and could be prosecuted. We as parents may also be held to account for any damage that our children may cause. Fireworks can be a marvelous treat but the reality of burns and damage is always there. Please supervise your children closely if you are celebrating Guy Fawkes at home this year.

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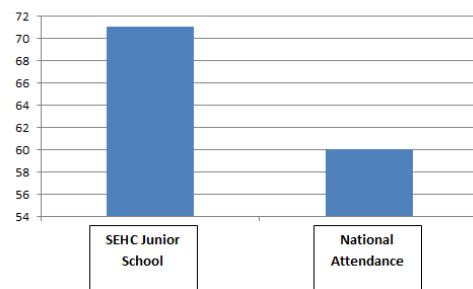
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
