Sapate Ako (Educational Sunday) was an initiative proposed and implemented by the Tongan Parents Teachers Association (TPTA) in order to lift academic achievement for Tongan students at NCEA level. 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Last year at the back end of term 2, 12 boys from years 10 to 11 were selected (by staff members) to be a part of a leadership programme hosted by a team of school social workers from ATWC (Anglican Trust for Women and Children). The purpose of the programme was to encourage the boys to learn and identify different leader-ship attributes and to in still self-confidence, courage and resilience not only at school but also at home and within the community. The programme consisted of weekly workshops through term three and four and concluded with a 6 day camp to the Great Barrier Island at the Orama Oasis Christian camp.

The camp exposed the students to different physical activities like river & beach kayaking, sailing and high ropes. The students also participated in spoken word and star gazing workshops. The camp provided a perfect environment for the students to develop trust within each other and also apply the attributes we had covered during our weekly workshops through term three and four.

A huge thankyou to the staff members who played a pivotal role in selecting students and approving the programme especially Kirsten Taranaki for being a part of the process from start to finish. Last but not least I would like to acknowledge the families for allowing your sons to be a part of this programme and attending the camp. The relationships and bonds the students created not only with each other but also with the ATWC staff is something I know we will all cherish.



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On Tuesday February 19th, the History III class, all twenty students left at 7-30 for our trip to the Waikato. We were to visit the historic sites relating to the Waikato War of 1863-64. First stop was the banks of the Waikato River at Mercer where we took the annual class photo and then onto Rangiriri. Here the battle site has been updated with the input form Tainui. Wandering through the pa site we could imagine Maori warriors holding out against the invading colonial forces. Next stop was Ngaruawahia where we saw Turangawaewae, the Maori King's official residence and visited the historic domain before we arrived at Te Awamutu. We were met here by museum staff, one of them a Tainui representative who introduced us to Uenuku a carving representing a tribal god of Tainui. This was one of highlights for us students because he explained the intertwining connections among Polynesian peoples, Uenuku and God. From here Janine Alison, the museum educator, took us around the sites of Rangiaowhia, Orakau and Kihikihi. Last stop was Pirongi redoubt where we had fun re-enacting past events.

This was a great trip because we were able to stand at the actual places our past played out and were able to visualise what happened there.
