For the last 3 weeks of school students and teachers have become innovators and creators. They have been busy creating very unique ways to showcase their own culture to the world using digital technology as the way to create. So we have some students making virtual reality clips using images from their Islands, writing about the place and recording their voices speaking the information. So when you look through the VR googles you able to see the sights in the island and hear the soundtrack telling you about it.
