

Into the flattened out boxes they then shoveled soil onto the boxes. When this was completed, they then placed coffee grinds around the edge of the garden to stop the insects from eating the plants. The last thing they did was planted all the vegetable seedlings. There is broccoli, cabbage, silverbeet, carrots, spinach, cauliflower, bok choy and rhubarb. Hopefully our plants will continue to grow ready to use for our Health and Wellbeing program where the student's will do garden to table cooking in term 3.
